Day trips with family once a month

The 2012 Poverty and Social Exclusion in the UK survey (which re-interviewed 12,000 respondents to the 2010/11 Family Resources Survey to ask them additional questions²) found that the families of about one in five children (aged under 16) could not go on day trips once a month due to a lack of income. Thus, about 2.4 million children were deprived of family outings in 2012 because of poverty.
